

METHODOLOGY

Emails were sent, and telephone calls made, to public access golf courses and local councils to gather their rounds played recorded performance.


The information contained in this report is collected from a sample of circa 200 courses throughout Great Britain.

Follow up calls and emails were made to those clubs and/or councils that had not responded, in order to collect all the data.

When calculating the overall national figures, the regional figures have been weighted to reflect the total number of courses in each region in order to more accurately reflect the pattern in the whole of Great Britain.

Comparisons can be made between the percentage change and the average number of rounds per month. The actual number of rounds played cannot be directly compared between the different quarters due to the different sample number of golf courses used in each quarter.

INTRODUCTION

CONTRIBUTING FACTORS

- Much of April was fine and settled. Plenty of sunshine generally allowed daytime temperatures to rise well above normal on numerous days. Rainfall was well below normal quite widely with only central southern counties of England having near average rainfall.
 - It was the sunniest April since 1929.
 - Overall rainfall was 40% of average.
- May began with cool showery weather which became more settled between 2nd and 4th. There was plenty of warm sunny weather between 5th and 9th, but showers broke out in places from 7th onwards. Northerly winds brought a cold snap from 10th 15th. There was a more changeable spell from 16th 23rd but with plenty of warm sunshine at times in the South. High pressure dominated from the 24th bringing generally dry, sunny and warm weather.
 - It was the sunniest May since 1929
 - Average rainfall was 47% of average.
- June began dry & sunny but by 10th it turned wet almost everywhere. Around mid-month there was a spell of warm, humid, showery weather with thunderstorms especially in central, western and southern areas. There was a hot sunny spell from 23rd − 25th which triggered a thundery breakdown in places. The last few days were cloudy and windy with showers and longer periods of rain.
 - Sunshine was 97% of average
 - Rainfall was 144% of average.

CONTRIBUTING FACTORS continued

- All courses were closed throughout April, Due to the covid-19 virus.
- In May golf resumed:
 - 13th England.
 - 18th Wales.
 - 28th Scotland.
 - Members had to book tee times.
 - Only two balls were allowed.
 - o The gap between tee times was increased.
 - Most Private members clubs did not allow guests or visitors.
- In June 4 balls were allowed again but tee times still had to be booked by members to ensure social distancing requirements were met.
 - Members guests and visitors were accepted but not at all clubs.
 - Hotels and resorts opened from
 - 4th July in England
 - o 6th July in Wales.
 - o 15th July in Scotland



ROUNDS PLAYED YEAR TO DATE - NATIONAL



All courses were closed in April.

May was 27% down on May 2019 with the vast majority of courses not reopening until the end of the month. In June there was a 61% increase over June 2019 which helped to reduce the quarter deficit to only 23%. The half year position is 26% down on half year 2019.
